Participating in worship today are guests Ralph and Tammy Stocks, Missionaries with Romani People in Eastern Europe since 1994. Ralph and Tammy have served as missionaries to Gypsies in Hungary and Romania (and Ukraine and Uzbekistan) since 1994.

In Hungary: They lived in Gypsy villages, planted Roma house-churches, took the Gospel into ghettos in eastern Ukraine, connected Hungarian Baptists with the huge Romani population in Hungary, pioneered a Gospel-based relationship with the Gandhi School—a residential high school for Romani teens in Pecs, Hungary (the only one of its kind in Europe)—arranging for missionaries (like the Adkins) to serve in this non-Christian school, built churches, sponsored countless mission teams, and conducted countless camps, retreats, health-fairs, and mission endeavors for Romani all over Hungary.

In Romania: They partnered with Providencia Baptist Church in Bucharest, Romania to support the Ruth School—an elementary school for Romani in the Ferentari slums of Bucharest, developed and supported the Gypsy Smith School—a Bible-training school for Romani pastors, launched the Naomi Center—a skills and parenting center for Romani women and girls, and served as resource and support for other missionaries all over the globe.

This is just a bare-bones list of the innumerable ways that Ralph and Tammy Stocks have been the presence of Christ in Eastern Europe—bearing fruit in all of these places at the same time. The seeds they have planted will be producing harvest for generations to come. Ralph and Tammy will be retiring as missionaries this summer. Surely God sees them and says, "Well done, my good and faithful servants."
